The Simpson Cup is an annual Ryder Cup styled tournament between teams of 13 injured Servicemen and veterans from Great Britain and the USA. Founder John Simpson, discovered a passion for golf despite his own life-long disability - offered spectators a feel-good story about friendships, support among fellow combat-injured veterans and the healing power of competition through golf.

September 2016, Oak Hill hosted two teams of combat-injured military veterans. Team U.S. and Team U.K. Team U.S. won by a 12 to 6 margin. Aside from a greater awareness of the issues confronting combat-injured military veterans, proceeds from the sponsorship of the Simpson Cup Matches go to the On Course Foundation - the event's charity arm, which helps introduce the game of golf to injured veterans, as well as finds occupational placement for them in the golf industry.

Along with Seneca's financial contribution, several members of Seneca's team were able to take to the course and cheer our competing veterans. Joe Votava also volunteered as a Simpson Cup Chauffeur.
